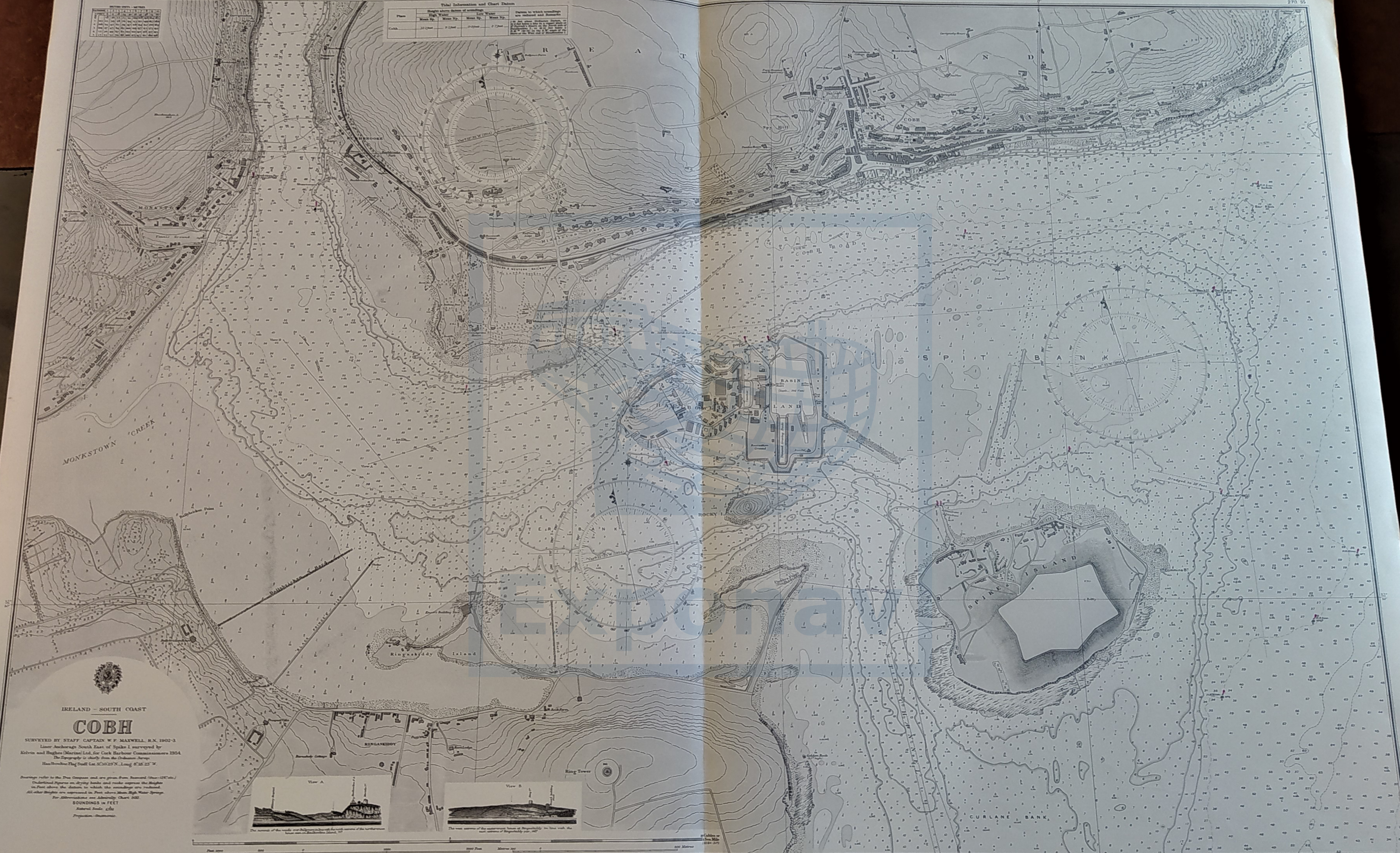

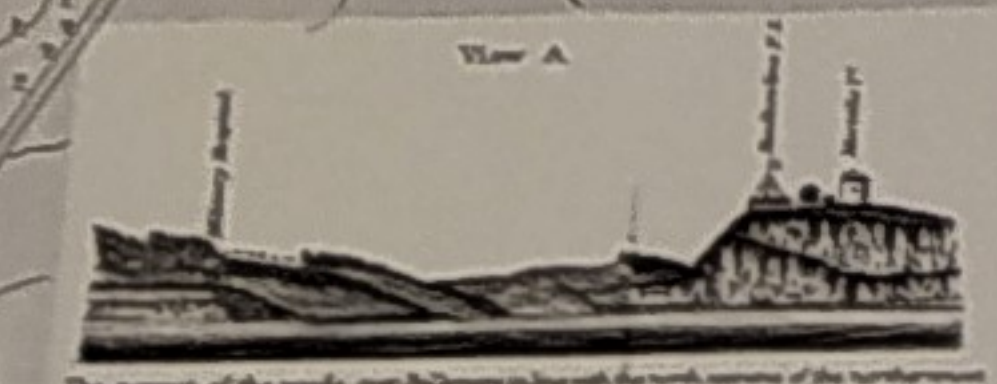


IRELAND - SOUTH COAST
